1. Is an Appointment Required for Showroom Visits?

2. What Should I Bring When Visiting a Showroom?

We suggest bringing your floor plans, cabinet drawings, or measurements of your space, especially if you plan to retain your existing cabinets. Additionally, inspiration photos and samples of tile, paint, or fixture finishes you have already selected will be beneficial.

3. Do I Need a Measurement Before Receiving a Quote?

No, we can provide a preliminary quote based on the measurements, floor plans, or cabinet drawings you provide.

4. Can I Select Personally Select My Slabs?

We offer an extensive selection of materials, including granite, marble, quartzite, and quartz. You are welcome to visit one of our suppliers to choose your slabs; however, we highly recommend visiting our slab gallery first to see if we have options that meet your needs.

5. Do my Existing Countertops Need to Be Removed Before Templating?

We can create templates with your existing countertops in place, provided no major modifications are being made.

6. Which Countertop Material is the Most Durable?

7. Can I Place Hot Items on Quartz Countertops?

While quartz can withstand heat to a certain extent, we always recommend using a trivet when placing hot items on quartz countertops.

Seams may be necessary depending on the size of the slab, the dimensions of the cabinet run, and installation requirements. Factors such as material, slab size, veining patterns, and layout will influence seam placement. Precision Stoneworks LLC will determine the necessity and optimal placement of seams, unless otherwise specified in advance.

12. Should Existing Appliances and Plumbing Fixtures Be Removed Prior to Installation?

Yes, appliances and plumbing should be disconnected and removed before installation. Precision Stoneworks will not disconnect or reconnect plumbing or appliances.

13. Why do you need my faucet, cooktop or range model number and sink model number before going into fabrication on my countertops?

Providing your faucet, cooktop or range, and sink model numbers in advance allows us to prepare and cut the necessary components in-house. This streamlined process helps ensure a smooth and efficient installation while minimizing any potential disruptions.

14. What's the difference in faucet spreads?

A **single hole faucet** features one mounting hole and typically combines the handle and spout into a single unit, offering a sleek, modern look ideal for minimalist designs.



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A **4" spread faucet** consists of three separate components (two handles and a spout) that are mounted 4 inches apart. This configuration allows for a compact design, suitable for smaller sinks while providing a more traditional appearance.



An **8" spread faucet** also features three separate components, but the handles are mounted 8 inches apart. This design is often used for larger sinks and provides a more spacious and visually balanced aesthetic, ideal for both traditional and contemporary styles.



Each type of faucet accommodates different sink configurations and aesthetic preferences, allowing for versatile design choices in any kitchen or bathroom.
